What we've won in 2023-2025

Legislated a Future made in Australia with **\$22.7B in support** of expanding our **domestic manufacturing industries**.

Establish the **Net Zero Economy Authority**, so that workers in our traditional energy regions have a say in their future.

Delivered billions in support for critical minerals to **ensure local production and process** for the net zero transition.

Supported Australia's aluminium industry with **\$2B** to assist with **securing AMWU member jobs** and the future energy needs of the industry.

Safeguarded Australia's sovereign **steel manufacturing** with **\$2.4B** - saving Whyalla steelworks and securing a **world leading future** in green iron and steel.

Delivered **\$500M through ARENA** to grow renewable energy manufacturing, especially Aussie made steel for wind.

Strengthen local content requirements in government tenders and big funding programs like the Capacity Investment Scheme.

500,000 free TAFE places, **\$325M for TAFE** Centres of Excellence and the **National Skills Plan**.

Established the **Australian Skills Guarantee** requiring 10% apprentice or trainee hours on major government projects.

Enforce **Same Job, Same Pay** reforms to close labour hire and permanent employee loopholes.
