How will the parties affect Australian Manufacturing jobs?

Union-won outcomes

A major investment in **Australian manufacturing jobs** through the *Future Made in Australia Act*.

New industrial rights including:

- Same Job, Same Pay for labour hire workers
- More rights for casuals
- Multi-employer bargaining
- Strong new rights for delegates

Measures that **support workers with the cost-of-living** including:

- Workers getting a share of the Stage 3 tax cuts
- Increases to the minimum wage
- \$300 annual rebate for household electricity bills
- Superannuation included in the National Employment Standards
- Legal action against supermarkets misleading customers with fake discounts
- 'Help to Buy' scheme, making home ownership more accessible

If Labor wins

Workers continue our campaign to support Manufacturing Jobs For Australia.

Workers secure union jobs and local supply chains in the places that need them, meaning that workers and their communities get their fair share of the wealth generated by Future Made in Australia.

Workers keep moving forward with our industrial agenda:

- Right to strike and right to picket
- Portability of leave entitlements
- Improved conditions for apprentices
- Lower retirement age
- Shorter working week
- Increased annual leave

Workers win further increases to the minimum wage, and further work laws that deliver pay rises for workers.

Workers campaign with our allies and win further programs that assist households to make ends meet, and then to thrive.

Workers win modular housing, being built in manufacturing facilities that are affordable and good quality, but also create safer and better paid jobs.

If the Coalition wins

The Coalition government will not support the issues workers and unions are campaigning for.

The Coalition voted against and does not support 'community benefits principles', demonstrating that they're more interested in the billions of dollars allocated to Future Made in Australia being about gifts and grants to bosses.

The Coalition has already made it clear that it will strip back workers' rights, and back in the interests of profit and power for big business.

Peter Dutton has said he will overturn Labor's IR reforms if he wins the election meaning it will be harder for workers to improve our wages and working conditions.

The Coalition has a long record in creating laws that keeps worker's wages lower, while corporate profits and CEO pay go up much like the last time they were in government.

Dutton's policies drive up inflation, adding to pressures on interest rates.

Workers will be poorer than they should be, and will continue to be squeezed by the cost-of-living.

There is a real choice for workers at the next election.



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
